### B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

#### Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local preachers, deacons—Christian education, deacons—compassionate ministries, deacons—music ministries, and prospective ministers of music who qualify according to the *Manual*, 410.

#### Courses

There are seven general courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board; elders, deacon of administration, deacon of compassionate ministries, deacon of Christian education, deacon of music, deacon of youth, and lay minister (*Handbook of Ministerial Studies*).

Ministers, deacons and deaconesses will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. An exception to this is provided for all commissioned song evangelists who held this status immediately prior to the 1986 assembly season. Those becoming commissioned song evangelists will complete the deacon track in music ministries. Those

interested in commissioned or registered song evangelists' credentials should study carefully all requirements as listed in *Handbook on Ministerial Studies*, 446, "The Song Evangelist."

### **Modes of Study**

The options for the course of study are listed below (by preference) as recommended and approved by the Illinois District Ministerial Studies Board.

1. A Nazarene university or an accredited university, pursuing a degree in a religious field of study.
2. Nazarene Theological Seminary.
3. Nazarene Bible College or NBC Ministry Preparation Program.
4. Northwest Nazarene University Online Module Courses.
5. Nazarene Bible College: NBC Track.

The course of study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are advised to pursue preparation or ordination by selecting one of the above-mentioned modes of study. Each student is assigned an advisor to work with in establishing a plan of study.

The courses required of college students are in the *Manual*, 424.3. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in *Manual*, 424.3. All college and university programs must meet these competency statements for course of study.

### **C. REGULATIONS FOR MINISTERIAL COURSE OF STUDY**

1. It is no longer necessary for students to purchase the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development*. This information and more can now be found on the Clergy Education website (<http://nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation/>) A candidate handbook can be downloaded for free from <http://www.nazarenepastor.org/ClergyEducation/LinkClick.aspx?link=Resources%2fUSAHB.pdf&tabid=74&mid=501>.

2. Each student is encouraged to take four courses each year. The general church requires 2 courses per year to be passed, to allow a student to continue. After the district license is granted to the student, only ten years is allowed to complete the 24 required courses, *Manual* 427.4. At 2 per year, the student will not succeed. Thus, the Illinois District has chosen to encourage students to complete 4 courses per year. All course work must be completed by the end of the assembly year (April) in order for the student to receive credit for that assembly year. The only exception is for those students enrolled in an institution of higher learning in which the class may not conclude until the board meets in May.

3. A student is placed in a study level based on the number of courses completed regardless of the level of the courses. The only exception is that the course on the *Manual of the Church of the Nazarene* must be completed before level one is considered complete (unless the student is enrolled in a religion program at a Nazarene institution) and before the student is eligible for a district license.

4. The secretary may not enroll anyone except by written letter from the applicant to include the following information: name (first, middle and last); address; telephone number; e-mail address; course of study desired; church where current membership is held; letter of recommendation from the church pastor where membership is held; copy of local license granted by that church; and official transcripts from colleges or other schools beyond high school. It will be the obligation of the student to see that all the information is sent to the secretary. An application form will be made available for anyone expressing interest in enrolling with the Board of Ministerial Studies.

5. Prior to being issued a graduation certificate, all students must be reviewed by the Ministerial Studies Board. The only exceptions are Nazarene Bible College graduates of the Bible Studies Course who are immediately issued a graduation certificate. No student will be graduated from the course of study without completing an internship program.

6. When a student moves to another district, the secretary of the Ministerial Board should transfer the student's records to the new district by contacting the secretary of that district's Board of Ministerial Studies. Students are strongly advised to keep copies of course record sheets and final grades. The district is not responsible for loss of data when transferring to another district.

7. Candidates should be prepared to appear annually before the Board of Ministerial Studies. These meetings are scheduled as follows: Effingham—Saturday, March 6, 2010 and Nazarene Acres—Friday, May 28, 2010.

8. Files for inactive students will be maintained by the Board of Ministerial Studies for no longer than 10 years.

9. Students are required to keep an active e-mail account while enrolled in the course of study.

### **College Students**

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with *Manual*, 427.1, 427.4.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with *Manual*, 424.1 and 424.3. Yearly updates should be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Ministerial Studies. The Board of Ministerial Studies will evaluate the final transcript at graduation, and no requirements stated in the *Manual* will be waived.

### **D. CONTINUING EDUCATION**

“Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry of which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units (CEU’s) (*Manual* 424.6).

In order to facilitate the fulfillment of this requirement, a number of qualified events will be promoted through the district and by other means. An individual may receive CEU’s by participating in a qualified event sponsored by the district, the general church, one of our colleges or universities or other approved method. When CEU’s are available for a sponsored event, notification of the same will be made at the event and the participants will have the opportunity to sign up for credits. Credits will be based upon the participant attending the entire event and fulfilling other requirements (if applicable) for the event (such as extra reading or writing when appropriate). In all cases, it is the individual participant’s responsibility to qualify him or herself for CEU credits.

The Board of Ministerial Studies appoints a continuing education director who shall be responsible to facilitate CEU qualified events and to resource individuals in obtaining CEU credits for events attended. Individuals may also contact the Department of Clergy Development directly with questions or for qualifying and awarding CEU credits for courses taken. All determination of CEU qualifications shall be made by the office of ministry. All records of CEU’s obtained shall be retained by the Department of Clergy Development and by the individual himself/herself. Courses taken for degree programs are not eligible for CEU credit.

## IV. Daily Proceedings

### Wednesday evening, July 22, 2009

Pre-convention services for the 66th Annual Illinois District Assembly began at Nazarene Acres in Mechanicsburg, Illinois, with piano prelude music by Mrs. Kathy Curtis.

Dr. James Spruce, district superintendent introduced Rev. Don Gadbow, Nazarene Publishing House representative, who presented new books.

Rev. Doug Krassow told about the upcoming Prime Time Retreat in Pennsylvania in October.

Dr. Spruce introduced guests to the convention; Dr. J. K. and Patty Warrick, Rev. Gary Haines, Rev. Rod Diehl, Dr. Allen and Virginia Dace, Dr. John and Venita Hancock, Mrs. Irene and Sara Spruce.

He then introduced the District Advisory Board members; Debbie Brandon, Judi Roarick, Herman Wallace, Jerome Williams, John Connett, Tim Crump, Mike Curtis and Allen Ebbler and thanked them for their leadership this past year.

District Administrator Associate/office manager, Doug Haynes, District Missionary Mark Copley and District Treasurer Bill Shotts were introduced to the convention and commended for their service to the district.

Department leaders Bill Brandon, NMI; Jim Blue, SDMI; and Jay Bush, NYI were recognized for their exceptional work.

Dave and Sheila Bailey were introduced for their faithful service as caretakers at Nazarene Acres.

Mission area pastors were introduced and also the Board of Directors for Nazarene Acres, Inc. family Camp Director Rev. Jim Frye and all those working on the camp grounds during family camp were asked to stand and received a round of applause.

Pastors whose church paid anything on budgets were asked to stand and were applauded. Those who had paid 100 percent remained standing, those who had paid budgets in full for 10 years remained standing, 25 years or more remained standing and were all applauded for their contributions and faithfulness.

Rev. John Francis, pastor of the Monticello Church of the Nazarene, was presented a plaque for his church for paying their budgets for 50 consecutive years.

The Citation of Merit Award from Nazarene Bible College was awarded to Rev. Brian Hay by Dr. Spruce.

Former district superintendents and spouses; Dr. and Mrs. Allen Dace and Dr. and Mrs. John Hancock were brought to the platform, and Dr. Spruce presented Dr. Dace and Dr. Hancock each with a certificate placing them both in district superintendent emeritus status from the Illinois District.

Illinois decadal summary statistics were shown on the screen and highlighted by Dr. Spruce.

Rev. Gary Haines led the congregation in singing.

Dr. J. K. Warrick, general superintendent, opened the 66th Annual Illinois District Assembly and presented Dr. James Spruce for his 6th report to the convention. He gave a challenging report, "How Do We Get A Vision for Missions At Home? "The Giveaway Church." He ended his report with the congregation singing, "Here I Am Lord," and inviting those who wished

to pray to come forward. Dr. Warrick prayed. His report was received by a standing ovation. Mrs. Spruce was escorted to the platform and presented flowers.

An offering was taken for ONU and Pensions and Benefits budgets.

#### **Thursday Morning, July 23, 2009**

Prelude piano music was presented by Mrs. Kathy Curtis. Dr. Spruce introduced Dr. Bowling and the Olivetians from Olivet Nazarene University to the delegation. They opened the morning session with singing.

Dr. Warrick opened the session with greetings from Nazarenes around the world now numbering over two million. His devotions came from Colossians 1, putting on love and losing ourselves. Lose track of ourselves and fall into the ocean of God's love. God is calling us to a deeper level of surrender. He closed his devotions with an altar call.

Dr. Warrick introduced first time delegates and visitors to this 66th Annual District Assembly.

Rev. Doug Haynes, district secretary, read the organization for the day from the assembly handbook. On motion, these were received.

Dr. Warrick suggested we also send letters of appreciation to the retired general superintendents along with the three new generals that were recently elected.

Dr. Gadaw, NPH representative, presented new books from the publishing house.

The District Board of Ministerial Credentials partial reports No. 1 and No. 2 were read.

On motion, the report was adopted unanimously.

Dr. Warrick again thanked Dr. Spruce for his great report last evening and encouraged everyone to remember the Spruces' throughout the year.

The Nominating Committee report was presented and on motion adopted. The Election secretary, Dr. John Connett, and tellers were called to distribute ballots to the delegates.

Mr. Bill Shotts, district treasurer, received a love offering for the Spruces. The Olivetians sang an inspiring song during the offering.

Dr. Warrick highlighted the constitution amendments from the recent general assembly as printed in the handbooks. Dr. Warrick read each amendment and a vote was taken on each one. Article No. 1—207 yes, 3 no. Article No. 6—214 yes, 0 no. Article No. 10—199 yes, 16 no. Article No. 11—215 yes, 0 no. Para. 31.2—216 yes, 3 no.

The District Advisory Board report was presented which was routine work and report for this board.

On motion, the report was received.

The Board of Ministerial Credentials—final report was read with corrections.

On motion, the report was adopted.

The Board of Ministerial Studies was presented. A motion to receive, second, questions or comments were called for. Corrections needed to be made so this report was put on the table until the afternoon when corrections could be made.

The Mission Strategy report was presented. On motion, the report was received.

The Nazarene Acres, Inc. Board report was presented. On motion, the report was received.

The Finance Committee report was highlighted by Mr. Bill Shotts. On motion, the report was adopted.

The audited district treasurer's report was highlighted by Bill Shotts. On motion, the report was received.

Bill Shotts also highlighted the budget report in the delegate handbook. This budget report was adopted. He was applauded for his work in this area.

Dr. Warrick explained the new budget plan that the general superintendent has endorsed. The recommendation is to change the budget formula for the mission of the church. The new budget formula's base figure will be ten percent of current year's local income. That amount will then be divided proportionally between WEF, Pensions and ONU to accomplish the mission. The district fund will be in addition to the ten percent base.

Dr. Warrick and Dr. Bowling also answered questions about the new Global Ministry Center in Lenexa. Dr. Bowling stressed, "We are not in crisis, we are in Christ."

The Christian Cultural Engagement report was presented and highlighted. The report was, on motion received.

The Church Growth report was highlighted. On motion, the report was adopted.

The Ministerial Staff report was highlighted. On motion, the report was adopted.

The following pastors were called to report for their churches: Waldo Perez, Arcola Spanish; Jeff Stark, Benton First; Rita Briggs, Decatur Oak Grove; Phil Alvord, Flora; Gary Clark, Marion Oasis Community.

The love offering that was taken earlier was given to Dr. Jim and Mrs. Karen Spruce. \$658.70 was given to them.

Announcements were given and the morning session ended with the Memoirs report. With Mrs. Kathy Curtis playing the piano, Rev. Gary Clark led the congregation in singing "Great is Thy Faithfulness." Rev. Jay Shoff read the scripture and Rev. Gary Clark sang "Beyond the Sunset." Rev. Steve Shotts closed the service in prayer.

#### **Thursday Afternoon, July 23, 2009**

The afternoon began with the Olivetians singing. Rev. Don Gadbow prayed the opening prayer and presented new books from NPH.

The Olivet Nazarene University report began with the Olivetians singing again. Dr. John Bowling, president, brought an inspiring report from the university. The group then sang two more selections. Dr. Warrick had an offering taken for the group while they sang another selection.

Clarification on the Board of Ministerial Studies report was made. The report was, on motion, adopted.

Ballot results were read from the official ballot. 229 ballots cast, 6 spoiled. District Advisory Board, ministers—Lawrence Lacher, Roxana, 89; Jim Frye, Murphysboro 133; Laypersons—Christopher Shotts, Pittsfield, 111; Galen Scammahorn, Roxana, 110. Trustee to Olivet Nazarene University, ministers—John Connett, Mattoon East Side, 93; Douglas Haynes, Godfrey, 126; laypersons—Becky Lonberger, Mansfield Community, 86; Judi Roarick, Auburn, 120. SDMI Board, ministers—William Haworth, Sherman, 82; Waldemar Perez-Lopez, Arcola Spanish, 106; laypersons—Marjie Longberger, Mansfield, 98; David Skelton, Flora, 106. The chair declared elected: District Advisory Board, minister—Jim Frye, layperson—Christopher Shotts. Trustee to Olivet, minister—Douglas Haynes, layperson—Judi Roarick. SDMI Board, minister—Waldemar Perez-Lopez; laypersons—David Skelton, Flora.

Rev. George Reader was present in the delegation. A microphone was handed to him and he brought an exciting testimony. He is 102 years old and a retired minister from the district. He received a standing ovation for his dedication and service to the Lord.

Pastors' reports continued with Willard Anderson, Mount Carmel; Kevin Donoho, Salem Grace; Jonathan Maloney, Taylorville; Wayne Clevenger, Urbana Lighthouse; Bruce McEwen reported for the Roxana Church. Jerry Gravatt reported for the Vandalia Church. David Sorensen reported for the Royalton Church.

All ordained ministers were asked to stand. All licensed ministers were asked to stand. Douglas Haynes reported that all ministers had reported to the district. A round of applause was given to the ministers for their dedication this past year.

A motion was made, second that the secretary can edit and publish the minutes.

Dr. Warrick asked for a motion to be made to declare the 66th Annual Illinois District Assembly to be closed after the evening service. There was a motion and second.

The Daily Journal report was read by Douglas Haynes. On motion, the report was received.

Dr. Warrick thanked everyone for their kindness to him these past two years and thanked them for loving the church and accepting people.

Dr. Warrick encouraged the district to turn around and win someone this year. "This is your year!"

Dr. Spruce gave announcements—Doug Haynes gave thanks to his assistants. The afternoon session was dismissed.

#### **Thursday Evening, July 23, 2009**

Pre-service music began with Mrs. Kathy Curtis playing. Dr. Jim Spruce welcomed everyone to the service. Rev. Don Gadbow presented new items from NPH. Rev. Mike

Curtis prayed the prayer for the offering, and Rev. Gary Haines led the congregation in singing, "Praise Him," while the offering was taken.

Dr. Spruce introduced first time district licensed ministers to the congregation and presented them with a covenant charge from the Illinois District and the Church of the Nazarene in which they responded they would keep.

Two ministers retiring and their spouses were brought to the front of the tabernacle. Dr. Warrick presented them with a plaque and Dr. Spruce presented them with a check from the district; Rev. Lois Aumiller and Rev. Don Devore.

The Statement of Purpose and Invocation was read by Dr. Warrick and the congregation read the Apostles' Creed together.

Rev. Douglas Haynes, district secretary, led the ordinands and their spouses to the front of the tabernacle, while Rev. Gary Haines led the congregation in singing "Holiness Unto the Lord."

Rev. Haynes presented the ordinands to Dr. Warrick. Dr. Warrick received the ordinands asking them a series of questions to which they responded.

Dr. Warrick ordained the following: elders—Willard Ira Anderson, Carl Edward Pinkston, Matthew King Van Gilder, Darin D. Workman; deacon—Russell D. Burch.

Dr. Warrick presented ordination certificates and expressed his personal congratulations and optimism to each ordinand. He then prayed the closing prayer and the 66th Annual Illinois District Assembly was adjourned sine die.

*How Do We Get A Vision for Missions At Home?*

*“The Giveaway Church”*

Illinois District Superintendent’s Report—2009

It was not the place either of us wanted to be, but it was where we were.

And so I said to him, “Hey, thanks for the gift of the cowboy spurs. I had not expected a Christmas gift like that!” He laughed in his familiar way and said, “O yeah, well, if you ever have to—use ’em on your board members! Spur them on to good works!” He paused and then said, “Just kidding, Jim.” Soon he closed his eyes, went to sleep and died.

It was my last conversation with dad. No, it was not the place either of us wanted to be—a hospital at Christmas—but it was where we were. Ever been there, some awkward place, some new venture not of your choosing?

It’s like dreaming that you are the leading actor in a play. When a scene is not going well, you look for an exit and pray for the curtain to fall, but to be true to the part means you remain in character and say your lines. You do not know how the play will end because there is no script! In fact, someone is offstage reading the lines for you to repeat. You know that the reader is both playwright and director. Though you cannot see him because of the curtain, you follow his cue and trust his sense of timing. You know the reader is God. And in the most surreal of ways you vaguely remember a refrain:

“I’ll say what you want me to say, dear Lord, I’ll be what you want me to be.”

Shakespeare said it succinctly:

“There is a tide in the affairs of men, which, taken at the flood, leads on to fortune; omitted, all the voyage of their life is bound in shallows and in miseries. On such a full sea we are now afloat; and we must take the current when it serves, or lose our ventures.”

The current rearranges life. Hesitancy indicates uncertainty and fear of the unknown. It is not what we’d choose, but it is where we are. Taking the current when it serves is pricey: we can win or lose it all. We come to prefer protection to opportunity, and we dread the consequence of failure more than we desire the fortune at high tide. You can only imagine what such conservatism does to a church.

God is all about concepts like flood and fortune, shallows and miseries, currents and ventures. We have a God who cannot be put in a box, who could send a text message to your Blackberry in italics. Sound over the top? Then consider this: “I need a womb in which to house my son prior to his birth. May I borrow yours for nine months?” Or, “I’m looking for a back through which I may bleed tonight in a Roman cell. Is yours available again?”

Given the prevailing disposition of hesitancy and fear within the church, how do you give yourself—how do you give your church—to a God like that?

*First, a Giveaway Lifestyle Brings Change*

“I grew up in a drug house with parents who were both addicts. We always had people at our house buying and using drugs. When I was five years old, my mom was sent to

prison, and one year later my dad went to prison, too.” Francis, a young African American teen from the Crossroads Church of the Nazarene in Fort Worth, tells her story.

“One summer day Codero and Dorothy invited us to a Peanut Butter and Jelly Kids Club. I went to the altar and asked Jesus into my heart. He loved me when I felt no one loved me. Best of all, He gave me a family when I didn’t have one.”

*Grow Magazine* featured this dying inner city church, pastored by Corey and Beth Jones, a caucasian couple ministering to African American apartment complexes. “Many of the black parents said when Pastor Corey called in their home that told them that this church and pastor were for real. In their previous experiences, no pastor had ever done that. People came because everything was free and people cared for us.” Regardless of color, income or location we can trust God and jump into the current. When you give yourself away, you give God an open door! If you take the current, lives will be changed.

Churches like Crossroads love people others pass by. This is the essence of the give-away lifestyle—being willing, even with your back against the wall, to walk across the street and give yourself to strangers. Calling is still an effective evangelistic venture.

We were in the middle of Sunday dinner at home when the doorbell rang. One of the two women said, “We’re sure glad you visited our church today, and here’s a small packet of information. Call a number listed to speak with a lay ministry leader. And y’all come back again real soon!” I was surprised, but not Karen. She simply asked, “What else would you expect from a good Baptist?” I replied, “Frankly, a box of tithing envelopes.”

On a stay-at-home vacation that Sunday, we’d worshiped at Houston’s First Baptist. Out of some 3,000 souls, surely we’d not be remembered and certainly not visited. I have to confess that a quick, polite and non-doctrinal conversation with a Baptist that day helped erase, at least for the moment, whatever critical thoughts I had about Calvinism.

Food, games or prizes—giving away at that level makes perfect sense. But at the loss of people or dollars level, giving away shifts from perfect sense to perfect nonsense. At least, so says Ed Stetzer in *Breaking the Missional Code*.

He writes, “Many people did not understand why, when we were averaging only 350 and were only three years old, we needed to send out fifty to seventy-five of our people to plant two new churches in one day.” So it was that Ed’s church, Millcreek Community in Erie, Pennsylvania, planted New Hope and Lake Pointe on the same Sunday. Get this part: “Those two churches in turn have helped plant four other churches. Hundreds more now worship Christ than would have if we had just grown our own church at Millcreek by addition.”

This again is the lifestyle of a giveaway church. Nothing is more counterintuitive and yet more biblical than seeing our church as a giveaway station. Stetzer writes, “This is where faith has to overcome human logic. Churches always seem to put off church planting until they are larger. This is true of churches of 100 and 1,000. There is never a good time to send money, people and energy somewhere else. Nevertheless, it is the only true way to engage in God’s work of exponential expansion of His kingdom. It seems that every pastor really wants to get into mission—if only his or her church was just a little bigger. They do not want to give themselves away until there is enough to share. That is not the way God does things. God calls us to give ourselves away and trust Him.”

Howie Shute, missionary to the Horn of Africa, spoke at the Holiness Summit about Sudan, Somalia and Ethiopia—definitely not the place you’d like to be. Note his giveaway perspective in *Vistas, The Changing Face of Nazarene Missions*: “Missionaries have often been guilty of exercising control over God’s movements. The Church of the Nazarene in the Horn of Africa does not even try to control the movement that God has started in places like the Sudan. Most missionaries want to develop strong churches before they allow them to plant additional churches. They think that the longer a church has been established, the more prepared it will be to plant a church. This is a myth. Time does not strengthen churches—training and involvement in active ministry do.”

Shute continues, “. . . the church that never plants a church and brings few if any converts into the fold will grow fat in knowledge but extremely weak because of its disobedience to the Lord’s commission to make disciples of all people.”

Not every church can start a new church. But every church can embrace our district mission—“developing healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors.” Could your church gain at least one new convert this new year? Or assign a portion of its weekly income toward budget payment? Is that too much to ask of a healthy, holiness church?

It is in Wesley’s sermon, “The Danger of Increasing Riches,” that his famous dictum “gain all you can, save all you can, give all you can,” is stated. He also wrote, “Whosoever

has food to eat, and raiment to put on, with something left over, is rich. Whoever has the necessities and conveniences of life for himself and his family, and a little to spare for them that have not, is properly a rich man.”

If God is sovereign, He is certainly sovereign over His church! Do we mortals muscle in and assume ownership of God’s territory? Who are we to fret over the care of His most cherished treasure? Our fear of loss may be more about ourselves, our future or our sense of place. Wouldn’t it be great if God could free us of all that?

Neil Cole in *Organic Church* identifies an organic church as “. . . going wherever the lost are located—cafeterias, universities, coffee shops, bars to lead the lost to Christ.” Are we that free—willing to believe that church might be done in unlikely places and with church building-shy people? No, we do not abandon our buildings, but we do abandon a mindset that says, “You know what—if they won’t come to us, we won’t go to them!”

### *Second, a Giveaway Blueprint Brings Focus*

We focus on barrier and perspective.

Billie sends her kids to Mass but avoids church herself. She and her husband live the American dream outside a small town on a large dairy farm. She attended church months ago with a friend, but nobody said much and she felt awkward and never returned.

Pantheistic and liberal Edward stays away from church because God for him is in the environment, philosophical thought, animals and leisure. Concepts like redemption, holiness and tithing are as foreign to him as Nirvana is to you.

Come on! What’s with people? We’re here for them; why don’t they get their act together and get in church? Don’t they know how good it is to be a tithing Republican?

George Hunter is correct in *How to Reach Secular People* by defining four barriers unchurched people have to cross to become Christians: (1) the image barrier, or how people conceptualize Christianity—whether too boring or too imposing; (2) the stained-glass barrier, or the music, sermon or insider jargon Christians use; (3) the gospel barrier, or the biblically authentic challenges of repentance and regeneration; and (4) the total commitment barrier, or the expectation of total surrender—including tithing and holiness.

A giveaway blueprint builds bridges over some barriers such as worship style and to other barriers such as the gospel. The church has a long history with religious custom that is largely unfamiliar to unchurched people who may have little or no religious memory. We do and say things that just don’t connect, and if we are not friendly and attentive when new people drop in, it should not surprise us that they just drop out. For outsiders can be made to feel like the outsiders that they really are.

We focus on health and energy.

Healthy churches have momentum, energy and passion for lost people. Unhealthy churches have a politely closed fellowship and cannot energize their mission. A healthy church shares its resources, talent, people and gifts. An unhealthy church preserves its assets less it sink lower. Outsiders can spot either church a mile away.

Marginal church health is a little like having a bad tooth and pretending that you don’t know it. Your smile and your capacity to chew are fine, but you suspect something is not right. A wise patient complies when the dentist explains that a root canal is necessary now to avoid an extraction later. The poor health of a church can be put in no clearer light.

When a church closes, its assets will support a NewStart, thus replenishing the Kingdom on another front. This is a perfect example of a giveaway blueprint.

We focus on mission and responsibility.

- We care about a clear sense of mission.

Eight Ford engineers saved the Mustang in the 90s with a simple mission: cheap, beautiful and powerful. Vandalia, Highland, Urbana Lighthouse, Marion Oasis, Collinsville’s Good Samaritan Ministries and Decatur Oak Grove’s Hopeful Heart Ministries all began with clear missions owned by just a few people. We had a goal of six new churches by 2008. Today we have four plus two compassionate ministry centers.

- We care about the benchmarks of finance and attendance.

Budget payment this fiscal year: Unified District, 83 percent; World Evangelism Fund, 89 percent; Pension and Benefit, 95 percent; Olivet, 80 percent. We raised \$9.7 million for all purposes, which is just over \$97,000 less than last year. Attendances are: worship: 6,526; Sunday School: 4,640; membership: 8,407; professions of faith: 310. Our statistics are affected by the closure of Lawrenceville, Ridge Farm, Harrisburg, Metropolis and Tilden.

- We care about our responsibility to Nazarene Acres.

Four interested parties have considered our camp site since it was placed on the market by the District Advisory Board in early 2009. The Board of Directors for Nazarene Acres, Inc. and the District Advisory Board voted unanimously to cease operations at the camp by December 31, 2009, with events held at other locations after that date. In May, the Board of Directors voted unanimously to dissolve Nazarene Acres, Inc., in harmony with its by-laws, with all assets and duties assigned to the Advisory Board.

- We care about supplying the needs of others.

Decatur First put siding on the parsonage at Griggsville which was a great witness in the community. Decatur First and Taylorville remodeled the parsonage at Paris! Tom Nees was right: "Growing churches are convinced that they are not the target audience."

- We care about giving liberal yet prudent support.

We cannot do everything, but we purchased a van so Urbana Lighthouse could get people to church; we paid New Church University registration for 18 pastors and laypeople; we will assist in transportation costs in 2010 so our children and youth can get to camps, and the Finance Committee and District Advisory Board agreed to pay from district reserves the portion that local churches would have been assessed this year in their Unified District Budget to operate Nazarene Acres.

### *Third, a Giveaway Attitude Brings Revival*

Our vision calls us to lean into the future and face the hard questions: Are we the healthy district which we set ourselves to be? Do you think the culture and climate of your local church is really healthy? I mean really healthy? Can anybody quote the district mission statement?

In our 2004 church health survey, 2 out of 95 churches were identified by the Natural Church Development survey as healthy. Roughly 50 were in need of refocus, 15 were in seriously poor health, 15 were too small in attendance to assure viable statistical results and another dozen did not want to take the survey. The district paid for the surveys.

Today more churches are healthy, but some have few children and others no new people. Others identify themselves on the life-cycle as somewhere between empty nest and old age. But many have lost the urgency by which they were born, and the fire by which they were tempered. Is this the place you really want to be?

Did we get here by degrees, like the frog in the boiling kettle? Or by default, as the automatic response when squeezed hard by the economy and ignored by secular culture?

I believe we have a need that a survey cannot meet, that a seminar cannot fix. We need a fresh God-encounter with reliance only upon Him and not upon ourselves, and love for others wholly transformed through Him. Wesley wrote, "We should chiefly exercise our love toward them who most shock either our way of thinking, or our temper, or our knowledge, and toward them we wish were as virtuous as we hope to be ourselves."

Jesus gave Himself away by loving the least likely into the kingdom such as the woman He met at Jacob's well near Sychar. He saw through her smokescreen of interest in ancestral worship practices. A Jew, He was not put off by missing His own meal to ask her, a Samaritan and a woman, for a drink. Nor was He vengeful when she raised doubt about His apostolic authority and finally admitted her moral mess. He was not content to merely airbrush with pretty words. Instead, Jesus offered her the same thing He offers us—a drink from the right well for a change—plus admission that He was the Messiah.

Jesus' did not fixate on custom, history, precedent, protocol, pride, fear—these and all the nameless dreads that threatened Him—to minister to her. Would we? And a revival started through a woman who had to use both hands to count the number of men she'd married and with whom she'd slept. I'd like to see a revival like that!

Howie Shute wrote, "Miracles have become commonplace in the Horn of Africa. Witch doctors are burning their magic charms on the floors of our district assemblies. The demon-possessed are being set free from their tormentors. Murderers are laying down their weapons and loving their enemies. The blind are seeing. The deaf are hearing. The most gospel-resistant people groups are turning their worship and prayer centers into Nazarene churches. A Book-of-Acts movement is taking place in the Horn of Africa."

This unnamed and famed-for-all-the-wrong-reasons woman went back home where everybody knew her name and reputation. Of all people, she created the makings of a revival the likes of which that town had never seen. I'd like to see a revival that everybody knew could have only come from God. I'd like to see—straight up—a genuine movement of His Spirit that could not be explained in any other way than renewal among those who attend church.

Revival will come when we face square on the trials we've made for ourselves or those made for us by others. Are we brave enough to stand beside the well tonight and let the Lord of Sychar search our hearts and speak to us about our own brokenness?

Revival will come as we pursue the rigors of church health. Will you take the current when it serves and avoid the shallows and miseries of doing church life in a vacuum, in the sterile but deadly place of polite indifference?

Revival will come when we take our place at the well as Christ's representatives, His ambassadors of witness to people who have no Christ. The Lord Jesus no longer stands at the well. Now it is our turn! We are His witnesses! If God could work through the woman at the well with all her issues, surely He can work through us! Who is standing at your well—your office water cooler? Who rides up at your bike rally? Who drinks coffee at your Starbucks? Who's been married five times in your town? The revival that reaches people who don't know God usually begins with people who do know Him!

## 2. District NMI President

Delegates, council members, zone leaders, Dr. Spruce, Martha Bean, pastors, honored guests and friends. This is my third such address to the Illinois District NMI Convention and this comes on the heels of a very historic general assembly. We have seen our first global NMI president elected who is not from the U.S., Rev. Jennifer Brown from the Caribbean, was elected to take the place of Rev. Eunice Brubaker. She has some big shoes to fill following Eunice. I know Jennifer will do a great job. She not only loves the Lord, she is full of life, animated, full of energy and she is committed to global missions. We know, when God puts you in a position, He will enable you to complete the task if you allow Him to use you. I saw this first hand when our own beloved Rev. Carol Techau stepped down as Central U.S General Council representative to the NMI and she was replaced by Martha Bean. Though Carol is missed, Martha has stepped up and done a wonderful job on the council while also being a district president and taking care of her family. At the general assembly, we saw the first general superintendent elected who is not from the U.S. Eugenio Duarte was in the assignment of Africa regional director when elected as general superintendent. Those of us that were on the Illinois District Work and Witness Team to ANU in October of 2006 got to meet him at a luncheon at Chancellor Leah Marangu's residence. He was the first African to hold that position. Now he is the first African to hold the position of general superintendent. We are truly a global church.

Last year, during this report, I challenged you that after today, we will not look back on what we have done this year. We will look forward to what we can do this coming year. We have done that. We have not looked back. We have marched forward. We have been in many battles. We have suffered loss. You cannot be in battle without suffering loss. We have won many victories. We have lost some very good soldiers. Their battle is over. They have gone on to their reward. We just lost Rev. Paul Black to a traffic crash just a few days ago, leaving a big hole in the Laclède Church and the hearts of his family. Those of us left must continue the fight. Our fight is different than a worldly fight. So much of the time, the work we have done does not appear to have had an impact. Oh, that is not the reality. Stay encouraged. Seeds have been planted. Plants have been weeded and fertilized. Harvest is coming! It does not matter to me what part I get to play as long as I am marching forward for the Lord.

Last year, we had as our NMI convention speakers, our own Brian and Lynne Utter. After convention, I was speaking with Brian trying to pick his brain in assisting us in getting just the right missionary for our fall deputation tour. He came to me a little later and informed me that his and Lynne's assignment had just changed since our first talk and they would now be available for the tour if we wanted them. I immediately checked with our district deputation coordinator, Sandy Stickler, and she was as excited as I was, so we locked them in. I heard it was a very good and well received tour. As district NMI president, I try to make every rally I can attend. I usually miss a few as my secular job causes a conflict and you know the old saying, you gotta eat. This time I set a record for me. I did not attend one rally. By the grace of God and the support of this district, I was allowed to be a part of the Prayer Vision Tour the general NMI hosted to the Horn of Africa. I missed the whole fall deputation tour, but oh, what an experience the Prayer Vision Tour was for

me. I have been on numerous Work and Witness trips and come back changed from all of them, but not like this. This was not a Work and Witness trip. This was a fact-finding mission. There were about seventy-four of us from areas from all over the world touring the Horn of Africa to see firsthand the explosion of growth for the Lord. I will tell you more about this life changing experience later in this report.

Our spring deputation tour was a very insightful time. Our speaker was John Moore, the coordinator of evangelism and church planting for the Eurasian Region living in Budapest, Hungary. I was able to make several of those rallies. He would start them out by asking if any of us were filthy rich. Most people responded in the negative. He would then go on and ask a series of questions like, "Do you have a bed to sleep on? Do you have more than one pair of shoes? Do you usually have a choice in what you are going to eat?" He then told us if we answered most of the questions in the affirmative, then by world standards we were filthy rich. He really got me to thinking. He pointed out that about ninety-five percent of the World Evangelism Fund is raised by Nazarenes from the U.S. Conventional logic, if we are truly a global church would lead you to think that this is unfair. When you realize we have most of the wealth in the world and also realize that when God blesses you materially, then much is expected.

When you think like that, then you wonder why we have not given more. John said there is an explosion going on in his part of the world where people are coming to the Lord in great numbers. I saw the same thing in the Horn of Africa. John told us in his part of the world, it is not unusual to have an eighty percent unemployment rate. We are panicking because our rate in the U.S. is over six percent. We are in an economic downturn. I am here to tell you the Nazarene Church and the Illinois District are moving forward. We have thirty-seven churches that received the Mission Priority One Award. Not all churches have reported that category to me, so I expect we will have more. The Illinois District church was budgeted to raise \$ 672,496 for the World Evangelism Fund. To date, we have raised just over \$605,000 which puts us just over 90 percent. I am told the final figures are not in and this number will be a little higher.

Last year, we raised 93.8 percent of our budgeted World Evangelism Fund. In light of the economic turn down, good job Illinois District! Approved specials—we raised \$203,361.73. Our total 10 percent giving was \$808,413.48. Again, good job Illinois District. Fifty-six churches paid their WEF in full with twenty-one of those churches over paying. Twelve of the twenty-one overpaying received the Award of Excellence. The Award of Excellence is given to a church that overpays its World Evangelism Fund by 3 percent or \$1,000 whichever is less. Two of those churches, Urbana Lighthouse and Highland are NewStarts. That is the way to start out. The World Evangelism Fund is the life blood of the NMI. It allows our missionaries to be on the field in one hundred fifty-five countries without having to raise their own support. Without our missionaries being in the field, who is going to tell people about Jesus? Who is going to then train the nationals so they can be self-supporting in their ministry?

Our district LINKS budget was \$1,400. The Illinois District gave \$2,615.25. Thank you Illinois District. Our LINKS coordinator, Norma Shotts, does a diligent and faithful job providing us with all the information needed and the encouragement and guidance for this district to stay abreast of our LINKS assignments.

I am very fortunate to be surrounded by a cadre of people who make my job much easier. First is my wife, Debbie, who has been my life partner for thirty-six years. She and I share the same passion for the love of our Savior and the drive for missions. She is my rock, advisor and best supporter. Judi Roarick, our NMI secretary is always ready and willing to work. She helps keep me on an even keel. Sandy Stickler does an excellent job as deputation coordinator. She does the hard work. She was able to obtain Bernie and Rhonda Slingerland for this convention. Mary Lou Reader has done an excellent job as Work and Witness coordinator. As you know, she did a great job organizing and leading a team to the Sun Valley Indian School. Abbey Heppe takes care of our children's projects and does a wonderful job. Cindy Frye works hard to stay on top of the Mission Call program. I have already mentioned what a great job Norma Shotts does with our LINKS assignments. Bill Shotts is always available when we have questions concerning finances, and always gives wise counsel. Pam Stevens, our vice president, is always ready to take whatever assignment comes along. Becky Loneberger is always willing to go the extra mile. Carlette Wankel can always be depended on to stand in the gap and she is always coming up with great ideas. Dave Bailey is indispensable. After many years on the council, he is still indispensable

as our campground manager. Dr. Spruce is always available. We are very fortunate to have him as our district superintendent. Our district secretary, Rev. Doug Haynes, is always ready to lend a helping hand. I receive a lot of help from our very capable staff at headquarters. Several of the headquarters staff were on the Prayer Vision Tour.

I told you I would tell you more about the Prayer Vision Tour. We were hosted by former Field Strategy Coordinator Howie Shute and present Field Strategy Coordinator Ermias Mekuria from the Horn of Africa to experience and learn from a Book of Acts holiness mission movement. We were able to witness the exponential growth of churches in the HOA. We flew from different parts of the U.S. to Washington, D.C. From there we flew to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, meeting with other NMI leaders from nine other countries. The next morning, we crowded six people and all our luggage into thirteen Toyota Land Cruisers, most of which had only seats for four people. Our General Superintendent Jerry Porter and his wife, Tony, were traveling with us. The farther we went, the worse the roads got. We started just after dawn and arrived in Jimma about 3 P.M. We checked into a modest hotel that could be described as best, Spartan. I had little idea that on the return trip, I would consider that hotel . . . luxury.

We cleaned up and went straight into a district assembly. This was the first district assembly of the Jimma District. At that assembly, the district was so large; it was divided into three districts. We watched Dr. Porter conduct the district assembly in an extremely crowded, hot room with the power off most of the time.

The next morning, we were up at four and on our way to Metu. We were given breakfast in a bag that consisted of a scrambled egg sandwich, banana and a bottle of water. What we thought were bad roads the previous day would have been considered good roads today. We had to use the four wheel drive function to get through several places. Arriving in Metu, we found out what it was like to be out in the country in Ethiopia. Did you know Ethiopians do not use silverware? We found that out. We went right into a holiness conference at the town civic center. This was a standing-room-only affair. People had walked for days to come to this. We witnessed crowds of people accepting the Lord. While in Metu, we slept on the floor in a Red Cross center. There were three toilets and three sinks for our group, but no running water. We did have a barrel of water we could draw buckets of water from to flush the toilets. This was much better than when on the road. On the road it was girls on the right, boys on the left. In some of the villages we went through, the restaurants had "drop" toilets. The countryside was gorgeous and the roads teeming with people, cows and goats. While in Metu, we ate outside, sometimes in the rain. We would wake up at about 4 A.M. to the Muslim call to prayers.

One evening, the mayor of Metu had a dinner for us. We were supposed to go to the *Jesus* film, but the dinner ran a little late. Local pastors came and told the local leaders that the police had stopped the *Jesus* film and threatened them if they started it again. When the mayor heard that, he sent orders to the chief of police to allow the film to be shown. On the way back, we spent the night in the Spartan Hotel in Jimma. Oh, how nice that hotel now seemed. When back in Addis Ababa, we spent the night and then left our team members from other countries as we flew to Nairobi.

In Kenya, we went to a game park for safari. Little did we know the turn of events that were about to take place. We are met at the airport by drivers in safari vehicles who drive us to the Amboseli Serena Safari Lodge. What a beautiful setting with wonderful accommodations. After a wonderful evening and a good night's sleep, we are up early for a game drive. All is well. We stop around 9 A.M. for a wonderful breakfast outside in the bush. The area is guarded by Masai warriors armed with clubs, sticks and slingshots to keep the monkeys away. About a third of the group is through the buffet line when there is an explosion. A cooking stove has exploded. Two of our women are burning like torches. We have a hard time putting them out as they have accelerant on them. Patty Williams, Wilma Yates, Phoebe and Carmen Esperilla are burned the worst. Others have minor burns. Patty, Wilma and Phoebe have serious burns. Carmen has some of her hair burned off and what appears to be second degree burns over a large area of her back. Patty has serious burns to her face, arms, shoulders, chest and abdomen. Wilma has similar burns only she also has burns on the front and inside of her thighs. Phoebe has the right side of her face and right arm seriously burned. We are six hours by car over very bad roads to the nearest medical facility. Two aircraft are brought in to fly the injured out. Now, the other side of the story. Sonny, Patty's husband, leads Phoebe, the African cook, to the Lord. Some things to think about. Life is precious and can be taken away at anytime. Are you ready? I saw adult African men openly weeping after the accident. They saw how we took care of our injured and treated the cook as if she were one of our own. The Africans were used to arrogant, rich, German, British and Americans that were very arrogant

and demanding people. I think the way the Prayer Vision Tour group handled the whole situation will be a long impacting witness.

Nothing in life is free. Someone has to pay the price. If you get a free sample, someone has to pay for it. If you get a free lunch, someone has to pay for it. It costs to minister to others. It takes time, effort, money, sacrifice and dedication. All of us present when that stove exploded paid a price. Wilma, Patty, and Carmen paid a much higher price than the rest of us. Phoebe, though seriously injured, received the free gift of salvation. Jesus paid that price. We all seem to pay a different price for different things. The cost for Phoebe finding the Lord cost Wilma, Patty and Carmen much more than it cost me. What price are you willing to pay for someone else to find the Lord? What price did someone else pay for you to find the Lord? What price did Jesus pay?

God is so good. I certainly don't deserve what He has done for me. Right now, part of the price I am paying is serving you as your district NMI president. I consider that a privilege and an honor. Though many are better suited and more qualified to do this job than I, I must tell you I enjoy being allowed to serve in this position, and I thank you for having faith in me to allow me to do this. This has been a hard year, but a good year. We have impacted others both near and far. We can and will do better in this coming year. We are a great district with a great heritage but I think our best days are still to come. We will work together to "Make Christlike Disciples in the Nations."

#### 4. District Missionary

Last year, at district assembly, your new district missionary stood before you to speak. He shared a vision of reaching our “Judea”—our district. It is a vision that is still cherished in my heart. But also, let me admit that that guy that stood before you last year hardly knew what he was talking about. I was too new and barely aware of the needs of our churches and our pastors. And, I’ve spent most of this year trying to get closer to many of you and to listen to hear your heartbeat, and share your burdens. I’ve learned a lot in the process.

I’ve also learned that fifty days a year is precious little time to attempt to do this. Our own church at Casey is assessing and refocusing and seeking a new vision, and so I’m working hard in my own backyard, as well as trying to help my neighbor with theirs. It is a great challenge.

I’m learning to spend the majority of that time building relationships and building our team. We have great resources of leaders and people across our district. Thanks to Dr. Spruce and those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year: Philip Alvord, Bill Brandon, John Connett, J. Craig Dillman, Kevin Donoho; Allen Ebblor, Jim Hammer, John Messer, Margaret Messer, Randy Miller, Timothy Mondy, Barbara Sheets, and Bob Turner.

Thanks also to our NewStart pastors, who serve on the frontline of our mission: Bill Brandon, Highland; Gary Clark, Marion Oasis Community; Wayne Clevenger, Urbana Lighthouse; and Jerry Gravatt, Vandalia.

I’ve learned how generous our district is when it comes to providing for those churches that need help in their mission. The Mission Strategy Team has distributed over \$30,000 in grants this year. With those grants we provided chairs, equipment, a computer, rent and pastoral assistance to our NewStart churches. We also funded Church Assessments and Church Health Surveys for three of our Refocusing churches. And, we paid tuition and lodging for six pastors, and eight layleaders, representing six different churches to attend New Church University. We also helped the Collinsville Good Samaritan Church to call our district’s first Transitional Interim Pastor, Doug McVay, who has served faithfully there since January.

I’ve learned that there are many pastors and leaders who are hungry to learn and share what they’ve learned with others. This year we succeeded in planning and presenting two Team Days. The first, in February, was held at Decatur First Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 150 attended the Decatur event and 75 attended at Salem. That means 225 pastors and laypeople received encouragement, training, and support in these two events. Thanks to Pastors Crump and Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available. And to all our presenters who provided such excellent workshops. Thanks to Allen Ebblor, our pastor at Pana, who did much of the work and planning. We hope that many churches will attend these events again this year.

What else is ahead? We have two training opportunities planned for fall and spring. On September 26, we will have Darrell MacLearn from the Dallas District here to teach a seminar entitled, “Understanding the Organic Church.” And, in the spring, we hope to have Darrell Bickers here to lead a seminar on the challenges of bi-vocational ministry.

We continue to pray about a NewStart in Effingham, where we envision a new congregation launched as a cooperative effort between several surrounding churches. Would you join us in praying for this city that lives in the shadow of the cross?

In April of 2008, our district conducted a Changing the Climate seminar with Larry McKain and collected input from many of our pastors and layleaders. Through the information gathered there, we’ve discovered the need to strengthen our zone relationships, increase communication, build networks of prayer, encourage churches to cooperate with other churches, and continue our focus on church health. This strengthening of relationships and communication will serve to support the accomplishment of our stated goals: That every church should take the church health survey, develop a written church action plan, and target new communities for NewStarts. Our pastors also need to be involved in some sort of coaching or mentoring relationship to provide accountability and encouragement.

Finally, and primarily, I am learning to depend on God to do a new work in our district. That work is nothing that I can accomplish on my own, but indeed is something that first has to begin in my own heart and in my own church at Casey. But, I trust that it will ultimately catch flame across this great district of ours. Could that fire also fall upon your heart and your church as well? I believe so. Let’s draw near to God, in the hopes that He will draw near to us, and fulfill the mission through us that we are learning to pursue together: To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors with a new passion, for new people, and a new Illinois!

We also helped the Collinsville Good Samaritan Church to call our district's first transitional interim pastor, Doug McVay, who has served faithfully there.

This year, the Mission Strategy Team succeeded in planning and presenting two Team Days. The first, in February, was held at Decatur First Church, and the second, in March, at Salem Grace. Approximately 150 attended the Decatur event and 75 attended at Salem. That means 225 pastors and laypeople received encouragement, training, and support in these two events. Thanks to Pastor Crump and Donoho and to our host churches for making these venues available. And to all our presenters who provided such excellent workshops. Thanks to Mission Strategy Team member Allen Ebblar who did much of the work of planning again. We hope that many churches will attend these events again this year.

In April of 2008, our district conducted a "Changing the Climate" seminar with Larry McKain and collected input from many of our pastors and layleaders. The Mission Strategy Team has summarized that data below:

The strengths of the Illinois District are: Our leadership, holiness heritage, our openness, resources, and training opportunities.

Our weaknesses include: Our finances, a sense of isolation among our pastors and congregations, and a need for better communication.

We hope to close the gap between our desired and current values by: Strengthening our zone relationships, increasing communication, building networks of prayer, encouraging churches to cooperate with other churches, and focusing on church health.

We envision: New church plants, reaching various people groups, stronger zone leadership and cooperation, and using new methods and means to reach people. These aims are in line with our goals, listed here, which remain unchanged:

1. The churches of the Illinois District shall have a written strategic plan for reaching the lost and church growth.
2. The pastors of the Illinois District shall be involved in a coaching movement and maintain coaching relationships.
3. The churches of the Illinois District shall strive for church health using the church health survey and the Natural Church Development process (or the Nazarene Missional Church Survey).
4. The churches of the Illinois District shall have a clearly stated target area and plan for involvement in a NewStart project.

Much thanks to all of those who have served on the Mission Strategy Team this year. Together, we are stewards of the mission of our district: To develop healthy, multiplying, holiness churches and pastors. Our vision for a new passion, for a new people, and a new Illinois remains to be seen. Let's pursue it together in Christ!

Since this was very much a year of uncertainty, we proceeded with caution, doing what was needed to be done to keep Nazarene Acres functioning and safe. Thus minimal work was done, but, Nazarene Acres was fully available for use by any and all who desired.

The board voted to appoint David Bailey as interim camp manager at \$450 per week and expenses as incurred.

The board voted to give David Bailey a Christmas bonus of one week's salary.

The board voted to allot David Bailey a weekly gas allowance of \$100.

The board voted to put the internet account at Nazarene Acres in Doug Haynes' name.

The board voted to give the metal lathe and \$5,000 to Joe and Janet Thomas as a farewell gift.

The board voted to change our rate charge to state: from 2 P.M. until noon the next day will be considered one day.

The board appointed Rita Briggs to head up a committee to evaluate, clean up and equip the nurse's quarters.

The board voted to update the nurse's quarters: purchase a pediatric blood pressure cuff and monitor, reimburse Lisa Sorenson for the adult blood pressure equipment she purchased, and purchase a stethoscope.

The board appointed Brian Hay to seek legal advice re: language needed in our user agreement to address security issues at Nazarene Acres.

The board voted to purchase two batteries for the scrubber.

The board voted to purchase ten fire extinguishers encased in glass—and that we replace the fire extinguisher at the caretaker's house.

The board voted to file articles of dissolution.

The board voted that we cease all operations at Nazarene Acres by December 31, 2009.

The board voted that, upon dissolution, all fixed assets of Nazarene Acres, Inc. be transferred to Illinois District Church of the Nazarene.

## C. ASSEMBLY COMMITTEES

### 1. Finance Committee

We, your Finance Committee, recommend the following:

1. That the base for each local church for calculating all funds be row 8 (total paid local interest) of the financial chart for the assembly year ended April 30, 2009, less row 1a (building and capital expenditures/equipment), row 1b (pastor's actual cash housing), row 1c (health and hospitalization insurance CAP, and row 2 (indebtedness on property), and that credits be given for row 9 as follows:

a. \$0—\$100,000 raised (row A) = \$4,000 credit

b. \$100,001—and above raised (row A)—No Credit

c. That a fund base of \$1,000 be set for any church where the calculated fund base is less than \$1,000.

2. That the Sunday School ministries allocation be .535 percent of the fund base and be apportioned as a separate ministries fund. The NYI allocation be .590 percent of the fund base and be apportioned as a separate ministries fund. The NMI allocation be .576 percent of the fund base and also be apportioned as a separate ministries fund. They should be sent to Shotts, Merryman and Company the unified district treasurer.

3. That the World Evangelism Fund be 15 percent of the fund base, Pensions and Benefits Fund be 4 percent, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund be 7 percent, and the Unified District Fund be 9.620 percent. The total of all funds not to exceed 20 percent of total amount raised for all purposes.

4. That every church endeavor to be 10 percent for world missions as based on row 25, total spent for all purposes, less amount paid for World Evangelism Fund and approved specials.

5. That the Unified District Fund be allocated as follows:

District Administration	97.82%
District Home Missions	0%
Campground Administration	2.18%
Church NewStart (Mission Strategy)	0%

6. That all Funds (World Evangelism, Unified District, Olivet Nazarene University, Pensions and Benefits, NMI, NYI, and SDMI Ministries) be paid monthly in 10 equal payments beginning in July or through the implementation of the weekly "Tithe and Offering Method of Budget Payment" as described in the addendum to this report.

7. That only churches that are paying in full the Unified District Fund, the Olivet Nazarene University Fund, the Pensions and Benefits Fund, the World Evangelism Fund, the Sunday School Ministries Fund, NMI Fund and NYI Fund be permitted to report all funds paid in full.

8. That no congregation be granted permission to go in debt for any building or improvement program, or the hiring of any staff or assistants, until it has shown the ability to pay all of its obligations, including funds paid in full for two years preceding the request, debt under consideration and/or the additional salary, and that the amount of the indebtedness and terms of payment not jeopardize the spiritual life of the church. Exceptions may be granted by the district superintendent only with the unanimous approval of the District Advisory Board (*Manual*, par. 235.4).

9. That every church prepare and adopt an annual operating budget for the church in accordance with *Manual*, par. 129.6 and 129.7. Should assistance be requested for the preparation of a budget, the district will be happy to provide such assistance to the church.

10. That October 4, 2009, be designated as Nazarene Bible College Sunday in our local churches and that a special offering be received and forwarded to the Bible College immediately.

11. That December 6, 2009, be designated as American Bible Society Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the general treasurer in Kansas City immediately.

12. That January 24, 2010, be designated as Nazarene Theological Seminary Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to the seminary in Kansas City immediately.

13. That April 18, 2010, be designated as Olivet Nazarene University Sunday in our local churches, and that an offering be received and sent to our district treasurer for Olivet.

14. That the salary of the district superintendent be \$55,156.50 annually, plus \$9,000 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and \$5,000 annually for reimbursable expenses and that he be given five weeks vacation with pay at a time convenient for him.

15. That the salary of the administrative associate be \$37,199.75 annually, plus \$3,000 annually be invested for him in a tax-sheltered annuity, and \$13,400.30 annually for housing allowance and that he be given vacation in accordance with *Manual* guidelines with pay at a time convenient for him.

16. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide a district-owned vehicle, plus travel and expenses, for the district superintendent.

17. That the District Advisory Board be authorized to provide travel and expenses, for the administrative associate.

18. That the district boards', committees', and councils' travel reimbursement be at the current IRS rate and that actual meals and lodging expenses away from home be reimbursed. These expenses to be paid from appropriate operating fund.

19. That the honorarium for the district secretary be \$3,893.40 per year, and that expenses for clerical help be allowed.

20. That the professional fees to be paid for accounting and bookkeeping services for the district including the medical fund be \$28,800 per year.

21. That a recommended rate of \$7.50 per hour be paid for temporary secretarial services provided for district departments such as Board of Ministerial Studies, School of Ministry and any other services required during the year.

22. That the local churches pay the health insurance plan for pastors and dependents, and for associate pastors and dependents; and that the district pay \$2,000 per year for the cost of the health plan premium for full-time commissioned evangelists and their families, and that the local church (where evangelist holds membership) pay the balance of the premium.

23. That our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and the life loans for the local church, district home missions, world missions, our colleges and seminary. That the Department of Stewardship regional representative, Rev. Larry Hindmand, 9625 Mason, Oak Lawn, IL 60453 (708-857-4770) be contracted by local churches for counseling service in life income wills and bequests.

24. That the local church boards strictly adhere to the provisions of the *Manual*, pars. 129.21, 129.22, 129.23, concerning the counting and the accounting for all monies received and disbursed, and an annual audit of the financial records.

25. That each local church treasurer use printed forms for reporting all monies received and disbursed each month, and that the pastor and church board be provided a copy or copies of the monthly treasurer's report (*Manual*, par. 136.4).

### **Finance Committee Addendum**

#### *The Tithe (10 percent) and Offering (3 percent) Method of Fund Payment*

The church treasurer is instructed to make weekly fund payments beginning on the first week of the new church year.

The amount to apply to the weekly fund payment is reached with the following formula: Total Income—World Evangelism Offerings × 13 percent = Amount to apply to weekly fund payment.

Detail: The total income for any given Sunday is equal to the bottom line of the weekly offering report form. All church income should be included on the weekly offering report form (Tithes and Offerings, Sunday School, Building Fund, etc.). Deduct from this total all World Evangelism Offerings (Thanksgiving, Easter, Prayer and Fasting, Faith Promise, and other Approved Specials). Then multiply this number by .13 (10 percent tithe and 3 percent offering for others). The total equals the amount to apply to the specified fund for that week.

All World Evangelism Offerings and approved specials are excluded from this formula since the local church should be seen as a conduit for these funds.

All salaries are to be given first priority over fund payment.

It is recommended that churches adopting the tithe and offering method of fund payment specify a rotation for weekly fund remittance.

Example:

Week No. 1 apply 13 percent to Pensions and Benefits Fund.

Week No. 2 apply 13 percent to District Fund.

Week No. 3 apply 13 percent to Educational Fund.

Week No. 4 apply 13 percent to one or more of the following, District NYI, NMI, SDMI.

Week No. 5 begin cycle again.

Once a fund has been paid in full, any remaining money from that week's tithe and offering may be applied to the next applicable fund.

The rotation is shortened each time a fund has been paid in full.

Once all responsibilities have been met, the weekly remittance can supplement the World Evangelism Fund (if needed), apply to ONU's Word and Deed Campaign, or be applied to other ministries as directed by the local church board.

### *Benefits*

- This method applies the biblical principle of stewardship to the local church.
- Provides for a more manageable approach (weekly percentage) to fund payment.
- It is based on income rather than expenses.
- Helps the local church to maintain an outward look.
- It can be done by every church, regardless of size.
- Provides a systematic plan to achieve full fund payment.
- Provides for more even distribution of fund money.

## 7. Christian Cultural Engagement

A. Whereas, in times when our culture desperately needs the church to be a living example of Christlike holiness and love, we strongly urge:

1. All our sisters and brothers in Christ to remember that we are called to be the Body of Christ in our world being empowered by the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father. As a result, we urge our brothers and sisters to remember the importance of corporate Christian worship and the practice of spiritual disciplines within the family and individually, believing that these are important ways by which the Holy Spirit shapes us into a holy people.
2. That pastors, evangelists, and leaders live and teach the scriptural doctrines of the new birth and entire sanctification, believing that the Holy Spirit bears witness to both works of grace through the infilling of His Spirit, and that the one biblical evidence of the latter is the cleansing of the heart by faith from original sin manifested by the fruit of the Spirit in Christian service: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal 5:22-24).
3. That the church *Manual* be made available to all in the church who desire it and the Articles of Faith (*Manual*, Part II, para. 1-22, pgs. 30-38) and the Covenant of Christian Character (*Manual*, Part II, Articles 27-27.3, pgs. 40-42) be read, or printed, and distributed to the church body at least once a year admonishing each Nazarene to diligently pursue a lifestyle that honors God, the church and one another.
4. That new converts be lovingly nourished and instructed in the way of holiness.
5. That all of our people, "in putting off the old to put on the new and holy way of life as well as the mind of Christ" (Ephesians 4:17-24), take to heart The Covenant of Christian Conduct of our church which gives guidance in areas of Christian ethics, entertainment, marriage and divorce, abortion, human sexuality, Christian stewardship, etc. (*Manual*, Part III, para. 33-41, pgs 48-60).

B. Whereas, ethics and values are constantly being questioned and changed by our society, the church must strengthen itself in its commitment and conduct. Therefore, this committee felt it vitally important to not only reaffirm our belief in Scripture and our Wesleyan guidelines, but to also provide useful information in this document to resource both laity and clergy to make the church both a beacon of hope and a model of holiness to our families, community and world. (Matthew 5:10-17; Ephesians 5:1-2, 8-14; I Peter 1:13-17).

We encourage our people to work with and in public institutions as a means of Christlike engagement with our culture on the local, state, national, and global levels.

1. Each local church should strive to provide educational and equipping opportunities such as:
  - a. Special Christian speakers and professionals,
  - b. In-service topical seminars and open forum discussions, and
  - c. Consider initiating special ministries that reach out to the needy in the congregation and community.

2. Our people should show Christian stewardship by becoming involved in civic, community and school functions and cooperating with other churches and civic agencies who share our ministry objectives. Our pastors, youth workers and

parents should maintain an awareness of the activities and promotions of organizations within the local school system and unite in an effort to oppose activities that do not comply with New Testament moral standards. Examples of civic organizations to offer aid and service to:

- a. Pregnancy resource centers
- b. Homeless shelters
- c. Habitat for humanity
- d. Credible Christian counseling centers
- e. Food and clothing pantries
- f. Nursing homes; senior adult organizations
- g. Appropriate parent/teacher organizations

We urge church leaders to make available the names and addresses of government officials and stress the importance of voting in local, state and national elections to ensure that issues pertaining to the biblical ideals of faith, family, and social justice are addressed. We encourage the above while being simultaneously mindful that our commitment to Christ our Lord must always be far greater than our commitment to any political party, agenda, or association.

## **8. Church Growth**

We, your Committee on Church Growth, make the following recommendations to the district assembly for consideration:

### *Commission*

We recommend that every church emphasize the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) in every facet of their ministry. We are reminded that the Bible should always be our main source and that the Great Commission remains as our primary motivation for church growth.

### *Prayer*

Remember that prayer should be the foundation for all church growth, and that without prayer; little of lasting value will be accomplished. We also recommend that the church provide opportunities for concentrated prayer and fasting during the church year.

### *Mission/Vision/Purpose*

We encourage every church to develop a mission statement, a vision statement, and a clear statement of purpose. These three key elements will ensure that we stay focused on God's plan for the local church. There are numerous books and other resources available to assist the church with this task. Any church needing assistance should contact the district superintendent and/or the district missionary.

### *Responsibility List*

That every church maintain an accurate, up-to-date list that includes the name, current address, and telephone number for every person on their responsibility list. This will allow for better, more consistent follow-up and accountability.

### *Calling*

That absentees, be contacted through a regular, systematic approach. This is not solely the responsibility of the pastor, but should be a shared ministry within the church among the laity.

### *Discipleship*

Emphasis should be given not only to evangelism, but also the discipleship. The new Christian should be encouraged to seek the experience of Heart Holiness which leads to a growing and productive Christian as a way to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:20).

### *Lay Ministry*

We encourage our churches to develop a partnership between the pastor and the laity, which provides for every member to be involved in church ministry (discipleship/evangelism).

### *Education*

That pastors and laymen take full advantage of educational and CEU opportunities, including seminars, workshops, videos, books, and especially the quality CLT programs that our denomination offers.

### *Evangelism*

That new and innovative methods of outreach and evangelism be explored. Consider how the resources of the local church, human and financial, can be utilized most effectively to see souls saved.

### *NewStart/Restart*

We believe every church on the Illinois District can and should become involved in prayer, creating or supporting new church starts. Churches can provide funding and or personal involvement of the local church body in calling, canvassing, etc.

### *Refocus*

That churches be encouraged to be involved in determining their church life cycle and whether or not they need to enter into a refocusing process such as the New Church Specialties. Contact the district missionary for more information.

*Personal Evangelism*

It is the privilege and duty of every Christian to share their faith with others. We encourage all churches to provide specialized training for various types of personal evangelism. Personal responsibility for evangelism should be emphasized.

*Revivals*

We encourage our churches to give top priority to annual revival campaigns. We strongly urge the use of full-time evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene. We also encourage the use of all media possibilities (TV, radio, etc.) to potentially reach as many as possible with the gospel.

*Servant Evangelism*

That methods of servant evangelism be employed in churches of all sizes and in all areas. Jesus Himself came to serve and to give, not to be served or become successful. Let us willingly choose to follow Christ's example as we minister to others. Such acts of kindness can serve to bridge the gap between the church and the world.

*Finances*

Set aside a portion of the annual church budget for purposes of outreach and evangelism. The Bible says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

*Evangelism Committee*

We encourage each church to review and implement the guidelines for a local Evangelism Committee as stated in the 2005-2009 *Manual*, pages 70-71, and section 110-110.8.

*Global Church Growth Award*

It should be the goal of every church to introduce each new convert into the membership of the Church of the Nazarene.

We challenge every church to establish minimum goals according to the following guidelines.

<i>Category</i>	<i>Morning Worship Attendance</i>	<i>Number of New Nazarenes</i>
Category 1	0-49	6 new Nazarenes
Category 2	50-79	9 new Nazarenes
Category 3	80-99	12 new Nazarenes
Category 4	100-399	The lesser of 12 percent of previous year's worship attendance or 43 new Nazarenes
Category 5	400-899	11 percent of previous year's worship attendance
Category 6	900 and up	100 new Nazarenes

Churches will be grouped according to size to compensate for variation in ability. Morning worship attendance will be used to determine the size categories.

This award will be based on achievement in three areas:

1. New Nazarenes,
2. Significant involvement in sponsoring a new church,
3. Payment of all budgets (including district and educational).

**9. Ministerial Staff Support**

We, your Committee on Ministerial Staff Support, submit the following in order to care for the welfare of our spiritual leaders and encourage their commitment to our spiritual guidance.

The district office and the Pastoral Support Committee want to assist pastors and church boards in understanding their roles in providing adequate compensation for its pastors and staffs. Support of the pastor by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the life of the pastor rather than a job where monies are paid for services rendered. Adequate compensation enables a pastor to fulfill his or her calling.

Pastoral support extends beyond the compensation and benefits for the pastor and staff and includes those expenses incurred by pastoral staff which is necessary to conduct the business of the church. Each church pays a sum to a pastor's ministry, which is divided into several categories: compensation, benefits and expenses. The sum of these categories is considered the cost of ministry to the local church, not all of which is to be considered the income of the pastor.

The district Pastoral Support Committee has developed guidelines for local pastoral support committees to evaluate their commitment to the ministry of the pastor. Anyone wanting further assistance in assessing or planning adequate compensation may contact the district office. In addition to consideration for the local pastors, churches should also establish a remuneration policy for pulpit supply, including travel expenses.

#### *Senior Pastor*

The senior pastor is the leader of the church and a leader in the local community.

#### *Bi-vocational Pastor*

A bi-vocational pastor supplements income by means other than church compensation. Churches should view the circumstances that cause the pastor to supplement income as a temporary situation to be resolved as soon as possible. The goal is to remove as many worldly concerns from the pastor as possible, so that the pastor may attend more intently on his or her life's calling. Recognizing that small and young churches may have difficulty in providing adequately for their pastor and family, we urge such churches to use what they are able to provide to the best advantage of their pastor and to strive toward the goal of full support.

#### *Associate Pastor and Staff*

An associate pastor is defined as a partner in ministry, on staff, whether receiving compensation or not. The church is to work toward a similar benefit package for the full-time associate as for the senior pastor (guideline to the church: an amount equal to 70 to 80 percent of the senior pastor's compensation package). Associate pastor and staff salaries should be negotiated in accordance with the recommendations of the senior pastor.

#### *Retired Pastor*

A retired pastor is a minister with retirement status. We recommend that retired pastors be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired pastors usually live on meager retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide for pulpit supply. Retired pastors are a source of experience and expertise that is available to the local church.

#### *Evangelist*

Often, the evangelist's only source of income is from meetings held at various local churches. We recommend that a full-time evangelist's minimum remuneration for such a meeting be an amount equal to twice the local senior pastor's weekly cash salary for each full Sunday in the special meeting (as recommended by the Evangelism Ministries of the Division of Local Church Growth). The local senior pastor's weekly cash salary and prorated insurance and Social Security benefits should all be included in the compensation. Additional compensation for housing and travel-related expenses should be paid in a separate check, allowing for maximum tax benefit for the evangelist.

#### *I. For the Pastor*

##### A. Concerning Salary:

1. That for all full-time pastors, every church provides a minimum of \$450 per week salary. By definition, salary should not be deemed to include reimbursements and cost of ministry expenses listed below in Section B, Paragraph 1. The Advisory Board is to make the distinction between full-time and bi-vocational pastors. That churches which are legitimately unable to provide for such remuneration recognize that their pastor is bi-vocational and, therefore, able and obligated to supplement his or her income. We recommend that the district superintendent or designated personnel monitor the suggested minimum weekly salary on the basis of the materials provided by the general church's worksheet and, when necessary, give strong counsel to church boards to provide the above-stated minimum salary and benefits.

2. That the church place, as an employee benefit, an amount equal to 10 percent of the ministerial staff's monthly salary in a tax-sheltered annuity each month for his/her retirement. This is the third leg of the retirement tier recommended by the Pensions and Benefits office of the general Church of the Nazarene.
  3. That the church review the ministerial staff salary at least annually and that increases reflect at least cost-of-living increases. That a letter be sent once a year from the district superintendent to the local church board secretary reminding the board of its responsibility in this area, and that a written summation of the board's action shall be returned to the district superintendent within 30 days of the local board meeting.
  4. That any significant increase in the annual amount raised for all purposes by the church during a pastor's tenure be taken into consideration at the time salary and benefits are reviewed.
- B. Concerning Reimbursements:
1. That the church pays reimbursements for all church-related expenses, and that among these are standard mileage reimbursement at the recommended IRS rate for personally-owned automobiles. To avoid additional financial burden on the pastor and staff during these days of rapidly increasing gasoline prices, the church board is strongly encouraged to monitor and comply with any increases the IRS may possibly make on its recommended mileage rate during the calendar year. Entertainment expenses, office supplies, continuing education expenses (books, tuition, conferences, etc.), gifts and all other reimbursable expenses deemed appropriate by the IRS should also be included.
  2. Church-related expenses of pastoral staff should be qualified on the basis of material from general headquarters, as well as the Internal Revenue Service. Every church should provide adequately to prevent financial strain to the parsonage family, and that every church provides 100 percent Social Security and full family hospitalization. That churches be allowed to maintain their present insurance program, and if churches propose a change, the change should be approved by the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.
  3. That the church provides the ministerial staff expense to all church-related functions, including the district and general assemblies. Lodging, meals and transportation shall be a part of this expense.
  4. That the churches encourage and financially support its ministerial staff to continuing education through school, seminars and conferences.
  5. That each local church board provides funds for the purpose of sending its ministerial staff to the general assembly.
- C. Concerning Housing:
1. That the church provides housing and utilities and/or adequate housing allowance.
  2. That the church equips the parsonage with a stove, refrigerator, air conditioning, washer, dryer, draperies, curtains and carpeting.
  3. That a minister could request the church board to adjust his/her compensation for any year in which it is anticipated that the minister will purchase major appliances and/or furniture.
  4. That the fair-rental value and the designated additional parsonage allowance should be entered into church board records at the beginning of each calendar year. When a housing allowance is established in lieu of a parsonage, a review of the allowance should be made annually regarding payment, taxes, utilities and repairs.
  5. That the Board of Trustees of the local church inspect the parsonage once each year in order to continue to provide for quality living conditions. No parsonage family should be expected to live in substandard housing. This inspection should be scheduled with the pastor and spouse and be done in their presence. Any necessary changes seen at this inspection should be completed as soon as possible.
  6. That the local church board makes all necessary arrangements for the ministerial staff's moving expenses.
- D. Concerning the Ministerial Staff's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:
1. That the church continually lifts the parsonage families in prayer.
  2. That the church remembers the ministerial staff's family with suitable gifts at appropriate times during the year and consider a gift of no less than one week's salary at Christmas.

3. That the church provide for vacation and time off according to the following scale (this schedule refers to total years in ministry):
  - a. One year in the ministry: two weeks vacation
  - b. Two to ten years in the ministry: three weeks vacation
  - c. Ten to twenty years in the ministry: four weeks vacation
  - d. Twenty or more years in the ministry: five weeks vacation (district assembly, Family Camp, ministerial retreats and seminars, and working in teen or children's camps are not to be considered as part of this vacation time allowance.)
4. In order to benefit the church and the health of the pastor, the church should encourage the pastoral staff to take a minimum of one day per week for family time.
5. That the church allow the senior pastor the privilege of holding a full week revival or speaking engagement of one or more days, not to exceed seven days per year, with the church to be responsible for pulpit supply without loss of salary to the pastor.
6. That the local church offer the pastor/staff two mental health days each month to be taken at the pastor's discretion, to be used at a time when workload or individual stress is overwhelming.
7. That the local church make available to its pastor a one month sabbatical at the end of each five years of uninterrupted ministry to that same church.

#### *II. For All Full-time Evangelists (Song and Otherwise)*

##### A. Concerning Salary:

1. That evangelists be paid at least an amount equal to twice the pastor's salary or a minimum of \$500 for each Sunday of the meeting.
2. That, in addition, Social Security on the amount of salary be summarily paid.
3. That evangelists be notified in writing at the time the meeting is scheduled of the minimum remuneration they can expect to receive from the local church.
4. That local churches avoid canceling previously scheduled revivals.
5. That a local church canceling a revival without notifying the evangelist at least 30 days in advance be obligated to pay the minimum remuneration in full, unless the evangelist is able to reschedule the same date.

##### B. Concerning Reimbursements and Housing

1. That churches provide for all travel expenses, lodging and food during the meeting.
2. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members pay one-half the cost of the district hospitalization insurance.
3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings.

##### C. Concerning the Evangelist's General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare:

1. That finances for revivals be raised in advance of the scheduled meeting.
2. That the local church sends a Christmas gift to all evangelists who have served the church during that calendar year.
3. That local churches having full-time evangelists as members provide encouragement and support for their ministry through prayer and such tangible ways as love offerings and remembering them on their birthdays and anniversaries.

#### *III. For Retired Ministerial Staff*

##### A. Concerning Reimbursements:

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members provide for their expenses to general and district gatherings they wish to attend.

##### B. Concerning Their General Emotional and Spiritual Welfare

1. That local churches having retired ministers as members remember them often, such as at birthdays, anniversaries and Christmas, with gifts of gratitude for their years of faithful service in the Kingdom.
2. That the Illinois District gives a one-time love gift to all elders upon their retirement. We recommend a minimum of \$1,000.

We ask that each local church board secretary and pastor receive a copy of this report from the district superintendent and that the same shall be read or distributed by the

church board secretary to the church board as a reminder of their responsibilities. The church board secretary shall notify the district superintendent in writing concerning the fulfillment of this policy.

## **VII. Financial and Statistical**

### **A. DISTRICT TREASURER'S REPORT Independent Auditor's Report**

To the Board of Directors  
Illinois District Church of the Nazarene

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities, and net assets—modified cash basis of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church NewStart, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2009, and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows—modified cash basis for the fiscal year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the district's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraphs, we conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, these financial statements were prepared on a modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

As more fully described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the modified cash basis of accounting requires fixed assets be stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation. Management has informed us that the district has stated its properties at estimated costs and appraised values versus historical costs as required by the modified cash basis of accounting. In addition, no depreciation expense has been recorded in the financial statements. The effect of this departure on the financial statements has not been determined.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above (except for the effects of valuing fixed assets at estimated costs and appraised values) present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Administration, Home Mission, Camp Ground, District Reserve, Olivet Nazarene University, Medical, Nazarene Missions International, Church NewStart, Camp Meeting, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International and Nazarene Youth International funds of the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene as of April 30, 2009, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets—modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows—modified cash basis. The accompanying

supplementary information contained on pages 11 through 28 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements referred to above and, in our opinion, the information is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

### Note 1—Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### Organization

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to provide administrative and financial assistance to the local Nazarene churches in the district. The organization is supported primarily through budget receipts from the local churches.

#### Description of Programs

Illinois District Church of the Nazarene offers the following programs:

- Home Missions—This program was established to assist churches in need.
- Campground—This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees/users.
- Olivet Nazarene University—This program was established to provide Olivet Nazarene University with assistance in the collection of budgeted funds from local churches.
- School of Ministry—This program was established to facilitate in the training of ministers.
- Medical—This program was established for the purpose of facilitating the receipt and payment of health and life insurance premiums for ministers, and to make partial reimbursements to retired ministers for their medical expenses.
- Nazarene Missions International—This program was established to provide support for missionaries approved by the general Church of the Nazarene and to support local churches in NMI programs.
- Church NewStart—This program was established to provide assistance to new church start-ups.
- Camp Meeting—This program was established to collect revenues and pay expenses for district week held annually at Nazarene Acres.
- Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International—This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and camps for youth participation (elementary level) and to support local churches with their Sunday School programs.
- Nazarene Youth International—This program provides spiritual, recreational activities, and trips for youth participation (junior high and senior high level) and to support local churches in their NYI programs.

#### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues, and expenses

when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) are not recorded in these financial statements.

#### *Basis of Presentation*

Financial statement presentation follows the requirements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-For-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the district is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. The district has no restricted net assets.

#### *Property and Equipment*

The district has recorded its property and equipment at appraised and estimated values, which is not in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Depreciation has not been computed on fixed assets.

#### *Income Taxes*

The district is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the district has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

#### *Cash and Cash Equivalents*

The district considers all highly liquid investment instruments with maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

#### *Investments*

The district has adopted SFAS No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Associations." Under SFAS No. 124, investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets—Modified Cash Basis. The district carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values in the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets—Modified Cash Basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying Statement of Support, Revenues and Expenses—Modified Cash Basis.

#### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### *Loans Receivable and Payable and Transfers Between Program Accounts*

Loans between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Assets—Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated. In addition, transfers between programs have a zero net effect on the Statement of Support, Revenue and Expenses—Modified Cash Basis and have been eliminated.

#### *Note 2—Concentration of Credit Risk*

The district maintains a material amount of its cash and cash equivalents at one financial institution. Accounts at this institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The total cash at this institution exceeds FDIC limits. The amount in excess of the FDIC limit totaled \$96,372.11 as of April 30, 2009. Securities pledged at this institution on behalf of the district amounted to \$1,300,000.00 as of April 30, 2009.

#### *Note 3—Investments*

Investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds. Fair values as of April 30, 2009 are summarized as follows:

Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, these financial statements were prepared on a modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities and net assets of Nazarene Acres, Inc. as of April 30, 2009, and its support, revenue and expenses and cash flows for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets—modified cash basis and the related statements of support, revenue and expenses and cash flows—modified cash basis. The accompanying supplementary information contained on page 9 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements referred to above and, in our opinion, the information is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

As discussed in note 7 to the financial statements, the organization has not been able to generate necessary revenues to become self-sufficient. As discussed in note 8 to the financial statements, the Board of Directors has voted unanimously to file articles of dissolution effective May 31, 2009. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that might result from the outcome of this event.

#### *Note 1—Summary of Significant Accounting Policies*

##### *Organization*

Nazarene Acres, Inc. is a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois. Its purpose is to glorify God by providing an environment where the Word of God is proclaimed through ministry events. The organization is supported primarily through donations and revenue from the use of facilities.

##### *Description of Programs*

Nazarene Acres, Inc. offers the following program:

- **Camp Ground**—This program was established to minister to various individuals and groups by providing a place for recreational activity, as well as providing a place to minister to the attendees/users.

##### *Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements are presented using a modified cash basis of accounting. This basis of accounting recognizes assets, liabilities, net assets, revenues and expenses when they result from cash transactions. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of this modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable) are not recorded in these financial statements.

##### *Basis of Presentation*

Financial statement presentation follows the requirements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-For-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets. The organization has no restricted net assets.

##### *Equipment and Vehicles*

Equipment and vehicles are capitalized at cost and are being depreciated over estimated useful lives of five to seven years using a straight-line method of depreciation.

##### *Income Taxes*

The organization is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service not to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code.

### *Cash and Cash Equivalents*

The organization considers all highly liquid investment instruments with maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

### *Note 2—Concentration of Credit Risk*

The organization maintains all of its cash and cash equivalents at one financial institution. Accounts at this institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The total cash at this institution does not exceed FDIC limits.

### *Note 3—Equipment and Vehicles*

### *Note 4—Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets*

As of April 30, 2009, the organization had no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.

### *Note 5—Description of Leasing Arrangements*

The facilities presently used to hold ministry events are leased under an 11-year lease arrangement due to expire on December 31, 2017. The future minimum lease payments under the current lease are \$8.

### *Note 6—Economic Dependency*

The organization leases the Campground from the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene and is therefore economically dependent on the district. If the district were to cease operations and dissolve all assets the organization would have no property at which to hold events.

### *Note 7—Contingencies*

#### *Going Concern*

Nazarene Acres received \$34,300.00 of the \$34,500.00 in donations from the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene. Management of the organization is aware that the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene will not continue to donate such large amounts to the organization for continued operations. Also, since the organization was unable to increase revenues to a point of self-sufficiency, the Board of Directors has taken the actions described in Note 8. Due to these factors the organization is no longer operating as a going concern.

*Note 8—Subsequent Events*

At the May 15, 2009 Nazarene Acres, Inc. Board meeting, the Board of Directors voted unanimously to file articles of dissolution effective May 31, 2009. The Board of Directors also voted unanimously at this meeting that upon dissolution all capital assets would be transferred to the Illinois District Church of the Nazarene pursuant to IRS statutes governing transfers between not-for-profit organizations.
